## 1. General Overview

Torrential rain fall starting from 19 September, 2008 has affected 29 VDC and 2 Municipality of Kailali Districts and four VDC and one municipality of Kanchanpur District. In Kailali, total 5, 422 families have been affected including 3992 displaced families as per report received from DC. Similarly, six peoples are reportedly dead, 1 is injured and 28 peoples are still missing. The reports are projected based on the telephonic conversation with the Sub-Chapter level volunteers. Out of 28 VDC and 1 Municipality, Pratappur, Naryanpur, Dhansingpur, Ramshikarjhala are most affected VDC. The figures and damage might have different counts as detailed report yet to be received from the field. The rainfall is continued since last Friday.

Similarly, flood and landslides incidents are recorded in Dadehuldhara, Dang, Bardiya, Salyan and Gulmi.

## 2. Situation Assessment

### **Kailali:**

NRCS DC has mobilized its chapter and local level volunteers for the emergency assessment and response. The report claimed that highway linking Dhangadhi to the affected area (near Pahalmanpur VDC) is damaged and transportation is apparently closed and also hampering relief and response operations. The details of affected VDC and related statistics are given below.

Emergency rescue is looked-for for around 1,030 peoples at Khailad Khurkhuriya, Ratanpur, Bela dhanchauri, Pathriyam Geta srilanka, lalbhoji and Hasuliya. Approximately 3992 families are self evacuated and taking shelter at 16 locations (mainly schools), though predictions is made around of 5000 families taking shelter in those locations, whilst 74 families of Hasuliya VDC are taking shelter at Indian jungle.

**Kanchanpur:**

NRCS DC has mobilized its chapter and local level volunteers for the emergency assessment and response. The chapter has still to access Dodohara and Chandani VDC, which was inaccessible due to heavy flooding. The chapter expects to compile all the assessment information by today. Around 1000 free bonded labors (Kamiyas) residing in Krishnapur VDC are now taking shelter in Road.

NRCS Sub Chapter in Bijwar has provided shelter to some affected families of Bijwar VDC. Makhali River entered in the ward no-11, 12 and 13 of the Mahendranagar Municipality, however detailed reports yet to be received from the Chapter. NRCS and DAO has planed a meeting today to discuss for detailed assessment and elaborating scope of response operations.

#### **Dadeldhura:**

Heavy rain fall continued since last three days triggered landslides in Joghbudha VDC, damaging Army and police barrack. The army and policeman are taking shelter at area forest office. Communication, transportation, electricity is blocked. Similarly, 5 houses in Kausabari VDC and 5 houses in Sisamjhala VDC are damaged. The reports claimed that several houses are supposed to inundate in the flood water at Simalkhet and Tatopani VDC. 1 house was collapsed at Amargadhi and reports of landslides cases from the several VDC are emerging out. NRCS DC is monitoring situation.

#### **Bardiya:**

Total 225 people of 49 families are displaced at ward no-11 of Gulariya Municipality due to flood. Similarly, 150 houses are submerged in ward no-1 and 3, out of which, 12 families are rescued by army and taking shelter at school. Rests other are reluctant to remove from there.

Total 11 houses are damaged by the flood at Sanoshree VDC and families are taking shelter in School. NRCS DC is in alert as reports of several other VDC; Majara, Guptipur, Saijanbaspur and Rajapur area are under possible risk. 40 house in Majara village and 50 houses in Kothighat are completely merged in flood water and 14 families are displaced, 1 house damaged in Dhodari VDC. NRCS DC is trying to communicate with the volunteers on the affected VDC to collect preliminary projected information. Rain fall is continued and Karnali River supposed to increase, if rain fall continues for next day. Transportation is completely obstructed and army peoples are using boats for evacuation.

#### **Gulmi:**

2 deaths are recorded in Kurga VDC due to landslides. The NRCS DC is doing detailed assessments.

#### **Salyan:**

One woman is trapped in the confluence of Kalimati Kalche and khairane ghat and waiting for rescuing. One child is reportedly dead in unknown VDC.

#### **Doti:**

Five peoples are killed by landslides in Laximinaryan VDC. Similarly 1/1 house are damaged in Bhumirajmandau VDC and Kapellekhi VDC. Transportation for Dhangadhi to Doti is blocked due to landslides, communication and electricity is out of order.

#### **Dang:**

Rainfall continued since last Friday. NRCS chapter has alerted its volunteer for possible deployment. One house is damaged by landslides and four peoples are injured and hospitalized.

### **3. Need Assessment.**

#### **Kailali:**

NRCS Kailali has only stocks of NFRI for 50 families.

An immediate need foreseen in the ground,

1. Non Food Relief Item (Tarpaulins for shelter, utensils)
2. Ready to Food Item (approximately for 10 days)
3. Staple food (still need to be assessed)
4. Rescue and evacuation

#### **Kanchanpur:**

NRCS Kanchanpur has only stocks of NFRI for 50 families. The Regional warehouse is in Kanchanpur. So stocks will be mobilized from there.

### **4. Red Cross family in action**

#### **Kailali:**

NRCS has so far distributed Sugar 150 kg, Noodles 25 cartoons, Bitten rice 180 kg, Tarpaulins 2pcs, Blankets- 25 pcs to the affected people of Geta srilanks and Bhajani. Total 25 families benefited. NRCS HQ has dispatched 300 NFRI kits to Kailali Chapter from its western regional warehouse, Mahendranagar.

#### **Dadeldhura:**

NRCS Joghbudha SC, field staffs and police team are moving to Joghbudha VDC for inspection and further assessment of situation. NRCS Chapter is doing coordination meeting with DDRC to plan for relief and response. The NRCS Chapter is soon sending assessment reports.

#### **Bardiya:**

NRCS Sanoshree SC has been in field for the assessment and response. Detail reports yet to be received.

### **5. Coordination**

NRCS Kailali DC has been coordinating with District disaster Relief Committee and other stakeholders at the district level. A coordination meeting is being held by today.

Central Disaster Relief Committee meeting held in Kthmandu on 21 September to review the situation as well as some decisions. Government has allocated NPR 50,00,000 to Kailali CDO and similarly some fund to other districts as well. CDO will remain the focal office for all relief action.

### **6. Constraints and Challenges:**

The assessment, SAR and relief distribution is being hampered by damaged road, continued rain fall water logging.

- The total number of affected people is still not clear.
- Communication systems are not working properly though CDMA is functioning partially. CDMA system will soon stop functioning as electricity is out since last night. .
- Access to the affected village is difficult due damaged roads.
